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WHAT IS THE HEART FAILURE PASSPORT?

The heart failure passport is a small patient-centered booklet that contains helpful information, as well as pages for keeping track of important details about your health. The passport is an excellent and easy way to share and transfer information from one healthcare provider to the next.

WHO NEEDS A HEART FAILURE PASSPORT?

All patients who are diagnosed with heart failure can benefit from the heart failure passport.

WHY DO I NEED TO CARRY THE PASSPORT?

The heart failure passport gives your physicians and other providers important information about your condition, helping them plan your care.

WHEN SHOULD I SHARE MY PASSPORT?

Each time you visit a physician or other provider you should show them your passport. Carry it with you in your coat pocket or purse for use at doctor or other healthcare visits.

WHERE DO I GET A PASSPORT?

Heart failure passports can be obtained from many Greater Lansing Area healthcare providers such as physicians, homecare nurses, or hospitals.
